## Dear Families,

The second half of the Lenten Term is well underway with lots of wonderful things happening at St Joseph's in recent weeks.

Firstly, it has been wonderful to see the children working hard to ensure they uphold their Lenten promises in school by praying, fasting and giving more. Each week we have been focusing on a different activity to help us prepare as we journey through Lent to holy Week.

During Lent we have chosen to support a number of charities including our local Gateshead Foodbank with donations now starting to come into school - If you can donate a tin or two that would be appreciated.

With assistance of Fr Anthony Cornforth, we have also linked with the Bauleni Special School in Zambia which supports both disadvantaged families and those with disabilities in Lusaka Zambia.

After a successful whole school live call before Christmas which included a question and answer with pupils and teachers, singing hymns and swapping prayers we have now established a good relationship with staff and children from the Zambian Special school.

Our aim during Lent is to collect as many pennies or coins as possible ready for our penny challenge in Holy Week which we will donate to our Zambian neighbours. We are also aiming to hold a special Olympic Sports Challenge Day in the first week back after Easter. We will be asking if families could kindly find a sponsor or two for this exciting challenging event organised by Mr Morris.

We have a number of parent class Liturgies in the coming weeks starting with Year 3 on Wednesday 6<sup>th</sup> March. This Friday we welcomed parents and grandparents from Year 5 for Miss Cohen's class assembly. Please see the dates section for Spring events.

# Reception

An exciting two weeks back in Reception Class starting our Spring Topic! The children are continuing to make such a lot of progress and are becoming fantastic, fluent readers every day.

This week, we were excited to discover the delivery of some caterpillars this week - the boys and girls really impressed Miss Duffield and Mrs Lewis with their knowledge of life cycles, metamorphosis, and topic related vocabulary! We can't wait to see them eventually emerge as beautiful butterflies.

We've also started our new key text 'The Extraordinary Gardener'. We have been learning all about our senses by going for sensory walks to see what we can feel, see, hear, and smell

in our natural environments. The boys and girls have proven to be extraordinary gardeners themselves, preparing planting beds ready to plant our own seeds in forest school!







Year 1

It's been a busy couple of weeks in Year 1.

We have started our animals topic in science and the children are loving it so much we decided to extend our topic into our choosing area with lots of different habitats. We have been sorting the animals into families and animal types and the children are now very knowledgeable.

We are now in the season of Lent and have been thinking about how we can be more like Jesus in our day to day lives. The children have also been learning about church and the different parts of the mass. We have used the mass kit to role play this and practise using the correct vocabulary.

We have had a very exciting week as we welcomed a new pupil to our class. The children welcomed Zara with smiles and kind words. I was so proud.

Year 1 also loved breaking the rules this week. They looked wonderful in their colourful clothes and some crazy hairstyles! Thank you for all of the donations. It is always very much appreciated.















Year 2

Another brilliant two weeks in yar 2. It was lovely hearing what all the children did during the half term, including going on holiday and trips to MacDonalds. We are currently in the middle of our multiplication and division module in Math and have been using counters and cubes to make equal groups and how to share.

An unexplained object appeared in our classroom last week. When we opened it, we found that it was full of toys, we were all confused where they came from. We explored all the toys and used a range of questioning to predict where they might have come from. We then described the toys using some wonderful adjectives. This is to support our new text in English Toys in Space.











### Year 3

Year 3 have had a wonderful return from the half term! We have started reading a new book in class and are loving learning about Ancient Pompeii. We have considered how different things must have been back then and all of the technology we have today. We have been using our senses to create a bank of verbs all about what the Ancient Romans would have experienced. We have made some predictions based on the book cover, and we can't wait to find out what happens as the story develops.

In art, we have read the Footprints in the Sand poem and created artwork based on this. We discussed what the poem meant and how we should always remember that Jesus is with us. We each took the time to write our own Lenten promise in class and displayed it on our focal point as a reminder each day that we should follow in Jesus' footsteps.













Year 4









As part of our Sacramental Preparation, we have been looking at what preparations that have to made to get ready for the Mass. We have looked closely at the different roles some of the parishoners take on to help. We know that ministers, alter servers, florists, the sacriston, musicians and readers all play



a very important role. We worked together to create posters to show the important roles these parishoners take on.

On Tuesday we all enjoyed 'Break the rules day'. Some of us had tattoos, sprayed our hair different colours, wore nail varnish, didn't bother to wear school uniform and we also had some very unhealthy snacks. One rule we did manage to keep was to work hard!









Year 5

Year 5 have had an amazing couple of weeks.

We have been busy organising and rehearsing for our assembly about space on Friday 1st March.














#### Year 6

# Gospel

Sunday 3<sup>rd</sup> March 2024 - Taken from John 2:13-25 The Third Sunday of Lent, Year B

Just before the Jewish Passover Jesus went up to Jerusalem, and in the Temple he found people selling cattle and sheep and pigeons, and the money changers sitting at their counters there. Making a whip out of some cord, he drove them all out of the Temple, cattle and sheep as well, scattered the money changers' coins, knocked their tables over and said to the pigeon-sellers, "Take all this out of here and stop turning my Father's house into a market." Then his disciples remembered the words of scripture: Zeal for your house will devour me. The Jews intervened and said, "What sign can you show us to justify



what you have done?" Jesus answered, "Destroy this sanctuary, and in three days I will raise it up." The Jews replied, "It has taken forty-six years to build this sanctuary: are you going to raise it up in three days?" But he was speaking of the sanctuary that was his body, and when Jesus rose from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this, and they believed the scripture and the words he had said. During his stay in Jerusalem for the Passover many believed in his name when they saw the signs that he gave, but Jesus knew them all and did not trust himself to them; he never needed evidence about any man; he could tell what a man had in him.
